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Introduction

National Disaster Relief Service Centre was established in 1996 as the National Disaster Management Centre under the Ministry of Social Services and Welfare. It came under the Ministry of Disaster and Relief Services by the gazette notification no. 1422/22 and dated 08.12.2005 to plan and implement relief, rehabilitation and reconstruction activities. It was named as the National Disaster Relief Service Centre by the gazette notification no. 1482/9 and dated 09.01.2007 and it was assigned to the Ministry of Resettlement and Disaster Relief Services. As per the gazette notification no. 1651/220 and dated 30.04.2004 it functions under the Ministry of Disaster Management.

National Disaster Relief Services Centre is situated in Colombo 07, Vidya Mawatha and function under the advice and guidance of the Ministry and the Secretary of the Ministry of Disaster Management. Its projects and programmes are implemented through the relevant District Secretariats and Divisional Secretariats according to the advice given by the Ministry of Disaster Management. At the same time under the monitoring of the relevant District Secretaries Development Assistants (Disaster Management) Development Officers (Disaster Relief Services) work as Disaster Relief Coordinators.

Towards safer Sri Lanka through superb post disaster relief service

Mission

To protect human life, properties and environment from both natural and man made disasters through disaster relief activities.

Objective

To contribute the national objective of sustainable development through minimized human suffering, loss, and strengthening national capacities for disaster relief.

Activities

- Prepare and implement programmes and projects to provide instant relief to the disaster victims.
- Provide relief to reconstruct housed damaged due to disasters.
- Provide guidelines to build disaster resilient houses to resettle people in disaster high risk areas and implement it.
- Implement National Natural Disaster Insurance Programme
- Manage local and international level relief.
- Raise awareness among people and public officers to face post disaster situations.
- Conduct training and awareness programmes for the officers engage in post disaster activities.
- Implement foreign aid projects.
- Implement disaster relief service preparedness and response plan.

Progress of the programmes carried out by the NDRSC in 2018

NDRSC plans, implements and monitors the disaster relief activities. Such activities are carried out according to the National Budget Circular 03/2016, National Natural Disaster Insurance Policy and the Cabinet approvals obtained from time to time and instructions from circulars. During the period from January 2018 to August the day today life of many people in the country were affected from floods, landslides and heavy winds. The NDRSC performed a huge task in post disaster response activities to support the people to face the inconveniences positively.

The special tasks performed during that time are as follows.

- ▶ Provide immediate disaster relief
- ▶ Provide insurance compensation under the national natural disaster insurance programme
- ▶ Implement foreign aid projects
- ▶ Obtain local and foreign aid and distribute among victims
- ▶ Provide disaster relief items

Provide immediate disaster relief

Provide victims of natural disasters with cooked food, dry rations and drinking water under expenditure head -1-6-4-2 1501

Accordingly, allocations of Rs. 5,373.88 million has been provided to the DSs by the NDRSC for droughts, floods, landslides and other disasters as at 31.12.2018 under expenditure head 2-4-6-1-1501.

Progress of providing relief to the victims of natural disasters

The allocations given to the District Secretaries as at 31.12.2018 to provide cooked food, dry rations and drinking water to the victims of floods, landslides, droughts and other disaster and its expenditures are as follows.

Providing relief to the victims of drought under expenditure head 1501-1-6-4-2

Due to the dry climate in 20 districts, 2044780 people in 567987 families were affected as at 31.12.2018. NDRSC carried out services like providing allocations for the District Secretaries to provide drinking

water for these people, providing tractors and bowsers to transport and store drinking water, providing of Lorries, bowsers and water tanks, providing dry rations for the people whose cultivations were affected from the drought and implementing food projects.

Progress of providing relief to the drought victims

Rs. 92.12 million provisions has been given by the NDRSC to the District Secretaries to provide the drinking water to the drought victims as at 31.12.2018.

Providing dry rations to the agricultural families affected from drought

According to the circular no. NDRSC/2017/01 dated 02.08.2017 issued

following the cabinet paper submitted by His Excellency the President to safeguard the living standards of the agricultural and labour families affected by the dry climate a dry ration of Rs. 2000/- per two weeks and Rs. 4000/- per month for a family less than three members and Rs. 2500/- per two weeks and Rs. 5000/- per month for a family with more than three members was given.

Provisosn were given for 09 districts in 2018 for the unsettled bills in providing dry rations in 2017. Such allocations are given below.

Granting insurance compensation under natural disaster insurance scheme.

Provide immediate relief to the people affected from natural disasters under the natural disaster insurance scheme.

Natural disaster insurance shceme was presented as a budget proposal in 2016 and it has been implemented islandwide by the Natural Disaster Relief Service Centre in collaboration with the National Insurance Trust Fund with effect from 01 April 2016. This insurance scheme pays indemnities for cooked food, dry rations and death compensations for the victims affected by tsunami, earth quakes, floods,landslides,

cyclones and tornadoes (drought and fire damages have not been covered) and providing insurance compensation for the damaged houses, furniture, equipment , machines and stocks in small and medium scale industries to the assessed value. The contribution from the government for the annual insurance premium for 2018 was Rs. 500 million. Under the Natural Disaster Insurance Scheme there is a coverage of Rs. 15 billion for natual disasters and Rs. 2.5 billion out of that amount is allocated annually to provide immediate disaster relief. There is an insurance coverage of Rs.

12.5 billion for the damages occur to the buildings in housing and small and medium scale industries under the property damages due to natural disasters.

Accordingly, under the National Natural Disaster Insurance Scheme NDRSC has released Rs. 191.23 million to the District Secretaries to provide immediate relief to the victims affected by natural disasters that has a coverage from the above insurance.

Provide compensation for houses, small and medium scale business places and its furniture damaged from natural disasters.

Under this insurance policy an insurance cover of maximum Rs. 2.5 million has been introduced based on damage assess estimate from natural disasters. Under this policy for a complete damage for a house,

compensation is paid without considering the income limit and small and medium scale enterprises that do not have another insurance cover and not exceed the annual income of Rs.10 million are entitle to get benefit from this scheme.

An advance of Rs. 10,000/- was given to the home owners to repair their houses immediately until the applications are submitted after completing the damage assessment to provide compensation for the damaged houses due to the floods and landslides that occurred from January to 31 August 2018. The progress of giving advances to the beneficiaris are as follows.

Implementation of Foreign Aid Projects

Construction of Sri Lanka – China friendship village.

Sri Lanka government received financial and material aids to provide relief to the victims of disasters that occurred in May 2016 and Republic of China gave 1.5 US \$ and using that money 60 houses have been built in Ruwandeniya Watta in Aranayakawatta DSD in the district of Kegalle and handed over to the beneficiaries families.

Completed houses.



Construction of disaster resilient houses under expenditure 106-2-4-12-2202 to resettle people in highly vulnerable areas.

Approval was obtained by the cabinet paper no. අමප/17/1216/715/017 and dated 27.06.2017 to evict the people who are living in highly vulnerable areas identified by the NBRO as at 31.05.2017 and to resettle the families in safer places.

Resettlement of families who are in highly vulnerable areas in safer places to minimize the loss of lives owing to landslides is done under the following three alternatives with the supervision of the District Secretaries and the necessary financial provisions and necessary guidelines are given by the NDRSC. This programme is being implemented in districts like Ratnapura, Kegalle, Kalutara, Galle, Matara, Hambantota, Kandy, Nuwara Eliya and Matale.

- ▶ Provide Rs. 1.6 million to purchase a house with a land.
- ▶ Provide Rs. 0.4 million to purchase a land and Rs. 1.2 million to construct a house.
- ▶ Provide Rs. 1.2 million to construct a house in a government owned land.

In 2018 the government allocated Rs. 1845 million to resettle people. On that allocation were used to construct new houses and to develop infrastructure facilities in the lands that have been used to build houses and such allocations are shown in the table below. The expenditure as at 31.12.2018 is Rs. 1578.83 million

For the resettlement programme 4,678 families have been included and out of that houses are being constructed for 1,765 families. 110 houses have been completed.

Progress of constructing houses for resettlement in Kegalle district inisheated in 2016

2039 families that have been evicted owing to the landslides that occurred and high risk of landslides in the district of Kegalle in 2016 are being resettled and the government has allocated Rs. 800 million of that in 2018. Rs. 643.74 million has been given to the Kegall Divisioanal Secreary and the cost as at 31.12.2018 was Rs. 385.88 million.

Providing relief to the victims of the explosion in Salawa Ammunition dump under expenditure head 106 – 2-4-7-1508

The explosion that occurred around 5.45 p.m on 05.06.2016 in the Salawa ammunition dump in Seethawaka Divisional Secretariat Divison did not damage the lives of the civilians but houses, business premises, movable and immovable property and othe resources in the surrounding areas were damaged. Seethawaka Divisional

Secretariat Division reported that 161 houses and business places were completely damaged and 345 houses were partially damaged. 1,322 houses suffer minor damages. Department of valuation supported to assess the property and othe relief services were done under the supervision of the Ministry of Disaster Management with the support from Colombo District Secretariat, Seethawaka DSD, Sri Lanka Army, Police Department and Pradeshiya Sabaha.

The Treasury has released Rs. 12.6 million in 2018 to pay compensation for the damaged property and using that provisions a cost of Rs. 574,250/- and Rs. 2,995,750/- have been borne respectively for damages to houses and property.

Allocations of Rs. 6,401,000/- were issued to the Colombo District Secretary to provide insurance claims for 54 damages to the vehicles according to the approval of the cabinet paer on. අප්‍රේම 010/823/1764/18/ and dated 22.08.2018.

Providing relief to the victims of the landslide in Meetotamulla garbage dump under 106 – 2-4-9-1501

A landslide occurred in the southern part of the garbage dump in Dahampura GN division in Meethotamulla in Kolonnawa DSD around 3.00 p.m on 14.042017. 33 people died in that emergency and 111 houses were damaged. 163 houses were

removed from the risk area. For 98 householders who lost their houses and who were evicted from houses, houses were provided in the first and second phase, 72 houses were provided in the third phase, and 170 houses have been completed by now.

As per the assessed value Rs. 46,941,000.00 was paid for 14 beneficiaries as at 31.08.2018 as compensation for houses.

Paying compensation for private lands.

Total no. of plots of land that should be assessed is 112. Assessment reports have been received for 108. Out of those plots of lands compensation has been paid for 98 beneficiaries and the total amount of money paid was Rs. **707,745,3640.00**

Construction of Safe houses as per expenditure head 106-2-4-13-2202

The number of people affected from natural disasters are gradually increasing. Allocations were given to the District Secretariats in 2018 to develop the sanitary facilities and infrastructure facilities in the selected safe places in areas that are vulnerable to disasters to minimize the difficulties faced by the people enabling them to face disaster successfully.

Implementation of training and capacity building under the expenditure head 106-2-4-2401

Rs. 1.5 million was allocated from the budget 2018 to conduct skills development and training programmes to develop the knowledge, attitudes and skills of the officers in the head office of the NDRSC, and the disaster relief service officers attached to district and divisional secretariat divisions and using that allocations 02 training programmes have been conducted at SLIDA for 60 relief service officers up to 31.12.2018. In addition to that, 07 district officer progress review and capacity development programmes were conducted in the Ministry of Disaster Management for 225 officers. A cost of Rs. 356,145.00 has borne for post graduate studies of the relief service officers and for various training programmes conducted by various institutions as at 31.12.2018.

Plans

- ▶ “Disaster Relief Service preparedness and response plan” is being prepared now for preparedness and planning to provide disaster relief at DSD level to face disasters that can occur in the future.
- ▶ Finalize and update the computer database prepared to enter information on “Disaster Relief Service Preparedness and Response Plan.”
- ▶ Update the software established to coordinate information related to relief services in collaboration with the ICT or create another such software.
- ▶ Through that software it has been planned to get information through DSD level to provide relief and to provide provisions and other relief services by the NDRSC.
- ▶ It has been planned to introduce a Bar Code System for the computer data base used to control stocks in Orugodawatta Store No. 07 maintained by the NDRSC. Further, it has been planned to prepare a packaging and rack system and it is expected to get the support of the private sector for that. It is expected to get the support of the private sector as a social service project of the private sector.
- ▶ Necessary action will be taken in the future to increase the efficiency of providing insurance benefits of the national natural disaster insurance scheme implemented by the NDRSC.
- ▶ It has been planned to provide capacity development programmes for disaster relief service officers and technical officers who are engaged in housing damage assessments. Further the specifications to assess the damages to the houses will be amended for the year 2018.
- ▶ Attach another disaster relief service officer to the DSDs and District Secretariats situated in highly vulnerable areas in the country.
